### STUDY SPOTLIGHT: MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS

## Can Some MS Patients Safely Stop Taking Medicines?

People with multiple sclerosis (MS) can develop a wide variety of symptoms, including vision problems, fatigue, pain, and loss of coordination. Many take medications to mitigate these symptoms for many years. This study asks whether some older patients with the relapsing-remitting form of MS can safely stop taking these medicines. These medicines have had only a modest impact on disability progression in older patients with advanced stages of MS, and they are expensive and have side effects. The study is led by researchers at University of Colorado Denver.
