STUDY SPOTLIGHT: MULTIPLE SCLEROSIS

Comparing the Effectiveness of Types of Exercise Program Delivery

People with multiple sclerosis often have decreased mobility, which can lead to more disability and less physical activity and participation in daily activities. Exercise has been shown to decrease symptoms of MS and improve mobility, but patients often face barriers to exercise. This project is comparing the effectiveness of exercise programs delivered at fitness or rehabilitation centers with exercise programs delivered virtually to patients' homes. This project is based at the Shepherd Center.
