STUDY SPOTLIGHT: OPIOIDS

Helping Veterans Manage Pain and Reduce Opioid Use

This study is comparing two treatment options for controlling pain and taking less opioid medicine. In one, a pharmacist care manager works with patients and their clinicians to find effective pain medicine options. In the second, a medical provider and a mental health provider work with patients to help them set and meet health goals, while clinicians help find options to treat pain. Researchers will compare which group experiences less pain and takes less opioid medicine. The patients in the study are veterans, and the study is based at the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities.
