## STUDY SPOTLIGHT: BREAST CANCER

### Testing Tools to Help Women Make Breast Cancer Treatment Choices

Women with low incomes and little education may have difficulty getting information they can understand about the trade-offs of treatment options for early-stage breast cancer. The options include surgery to remove one or both breasts or surgery that saves as much of the breasts as possible, followed by radiation. Each has benefits and risks. This study is comparing whether either of two types of decision aids is more effective than the other or usual care in helping women make decisions that reflect what matters most to them. This study is based at Dartmouth College.
