STUDY SPOTLIGHT: MENTAL AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH

Are Treatment Groups Led by Peers as Effective as Groups Led by Counselors for Treating Posttraumatic Stress Disorder and Substance Use Disorder?

People who have experienced serious trauma may develop posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD) or a substance-use disorder. In this study, people with PTSD or with a substance use disorder participated in peer-led or counselor-led Seeking Safety therapy sessions. Seeking Safety is a treatment program to help people with these disorders. Researchers found that people in both the peer-led and counselor-led sessions reported fewer PTSD symptoms, used drugs and alcohol less, and had better mental health after attending the sessions.
