Making Better Use of Randomized Trials: Assessing Applicability and Transporting Causal Effects

This study aims to develop and evaluate methods for assessing how accurately randomized controlled trial results can be applied to broader populations. The study will apply insights from theoretical and simulation studies to the high-impact clinical topics of stroke and heart disease. A stakeholder panel of patients, clinicians, methodologists, guideline developers, and representatives from federal agencies will contribute to designing and conducting the project.
